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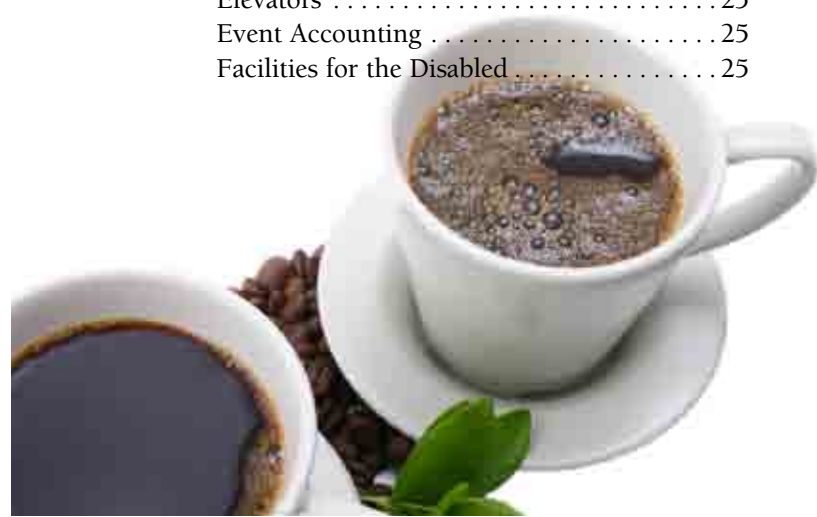

ABOUT SUMMERSIDE

The wharves of Historic Summerside reach out to meet the waters of Bedeque Bay on the south slope of a narrow land bridge that links our West island with our East – bordered on the North by a body of water – Malpeque Bay – that spawned the world famous Malpeque oyster first recognized in 1880s Paris as the World’s Best! Rich in history as vulnerable and precious as the oyster itself, this 16,000 strong urban area is bordered by two of the great bay playgrounds of Prince Edward Island. Once renowned as a wooden shipbuilding centre, it is homeland to descendants of United Empire Loyalists who fled the new born United States of America in the 1780s only to be joined a century later by many descendants of Acadians who abandoned certain poverty in their rural homelands west, for a chance at a new life in the bustling town of Summerside. Along with many others of English, Scottish and Irish ancestry they saw Summerside founded in 1877 and started calling its leader “Mayor” and its elected representatives “Councillors” at the turn of the 20th century.

Industry, Commerce and Transportation grew up together in 19th Century Summerside. The reason why is simple: Location. Wooden shipbuilding relocated to

Summerside’s deep water channel and export of farming, fishing and manufacturing product followed, moving in chiefly from the less favourable shipping location of Bedeque at the East end of the bay. People gathered in Summerside to meet the trains

and the steamships of the later 19th and early 20th centuries. It was not a political centre, it was a place where people met to do business. It was a place on the doorstep to the larger world of Europe, North America and the West Indies and sail or steam would take you to the far corners of the world.

It was never a one-way street. A most striking thing happened 1910 – 1940 when the world beat a path to the hotels, shops and vendors of Summerside in search of the Silver Black Fox. This was the world headquarters and founding place for the industry and many became very wealthy as a result – the streets were crowded with fox breeders selling their wares and carting off suitcases of cash in some cases. It was a time of unprecedented wealth and a source of lore and legend!

The results of the shipbuilding and mercantile successes of the 1800s were compounded by the wealth of the silver black fox industry leaving behind a legacy of highly concentrated impressive residential architecture that spans the 1860s to the 1930s. All this despite a devastating fire: The Great Fire of 1906 destroyed upwards of 150 structures, mostly residential. The people kept

coming back and rebuilding in the face of adversity, gathering and settling here to start anew.

The most recent wave of historical change came with the RCAF Station Summerside which existed 1941 to 1992, a half century of military life on the air force base at nearby North St Eleanors. Springing from the Second World War, life spilled over into the streets and

homes and social and economic fabric of Summerside and surrounding area. Recruits from all over the British Commonwealth met the locals and once again, like the sailing vessels of old bringing new things and experiences, the old met the new and each would learn and benefit from the other. Eventually this too would pass but Summerside continues – Open and welcoming to the world in a tradition that began long ago.

LOCATION

Centrally located on the Island, and only 40 minutes from Charlottetown Airport and 1 hour away from Moncton International Airport, make it easy to call Summerside home. We're a little like the hub on a wheel: no matter which way you turn, you'll find

every resource you need to make your meeting or event a success, including shopping, first-class dining, and a wide variety of unique attractions, entertainment, sporting events, festivals, and museums.

By air ... there are four airlines that service the Island, providing corporate charter air service and scheduled airline service to Prince Edward Island. Direct flights to and from Toronto, Montreal and up to six daily flights from Halifax, Nova Scotia are operated from the Charlottetown Airport, a mere 40 minutes from Summerside. Private aircraft and pilots can take advantage of the Summerside Airport, owned and operated by Slemmon Park Corporation. The Summerside Airport, with its free air space, is located minutes from downtown offering a full complement of services to the air industry. As well, Summerside is a little over an hour drive from Moncton International Airport.

By bridge ... Summerside is 28 kilometres from the Confederation Bridge which links the Island to the mainland. This 13-kilometre engineering marvel is a quick, convenient, dramatic way to arrive or depart the Island. The Bridge is open all year round, 24 hours a day and takes approximately 12 minutes to cross.

ACCESS

Access to the Veterans Convention Centre is located off Notre Dame Street. The best route is to follow Water Street downtown to Central Street North, taking a left on Notre Dame Street. Proceeding roughly 1 Kilometre you will find the Veterans Convention Centre on your right hand side. Parking is available on the west side of the complex.

ADHESIVES

Posters, banners and other similar materials may be hung in the Veterans Convention Centre subject to the prior approval of your Event Manager. Double back tape, normally used to secure many types of floor covering, is not allowed in the Veterans Convention Centre.

ADVERTISING, PUBLICITY, PROMOTION

Prior written approval is required for the use of the logotype, trademarks, symbols or trade name or names of the Veterans Convention Centre in connection with any production, promotion, service, publication, public statements, public discussions or advertisements.

The Veterans Convention Centre is pleased to offer confirmed clients a selection of conference promotional tools. Veterans Convention Centre logo and logotype are trademarked. Digital files are available to all clients with contracted events at the Veterans Convention Centre.

Colour slides and pictures are available free of charge for reproduction in conference programs and advertising. Advertising for your event may not commence before receipt of your signed contract. Your Event Manager must approve all advertising with reference to the Veterans Convention Centre.

ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION

The Veterans Convention Centre is committed to the responsible sale and service of alcohol. The consumption of alcoholic beverages is restricted to the licensed function areas of the Veterans Convention Centre.

ANIMALS

Animals, birds or pets of any description on Veterans Convention Centre premises require written authorization.



AUDIOVISUAL

Veterans Convention Centre is equipped with the latest technology and audio visual equipment. Our on-site well maintained equipment includes, but is not limited to:

- complete sound system
- multimedia projection systems
- video conferencing systems
- assistive listening systems
- high speed internet
- projection screens (all types)
- video players
- monitors and projectors
- microphones (all types)
- wireless technology
- DVD and much more

BANNERS/SIGNS/DECORATIONS

No holes may be drilled, nails driven, hooks, screws or pushpins tacked into any part of the Centre or its equipment (including tables); this is strictly forbidden. Under no circumstances may banners, decorations or signs and similar material be nailed, stapled, screwed, taped or attached to ceilings, walls or other painted surfaces without prior approval from the Veterans Convention Centre staff. Failure to comply will result in a damage charge to the client.

We would ask that all banners, signs and decorations be removed immediately following the close of the event or function. All materials not removed will incur a charge to the client.



CLEANING SERVICES

The Veterans Convention Centre will ensure that all public areas, function rooms, prefunction areas and wash-rooms are properly cleaned and maintained throughout your event. Please contact your Event Manager if you anticipate your event will require additional or continuous cleaning services. Veterans Convention Centre Housekeeping will provide daily cleaning for exhibitions or trade shows and will remove refuse from the show area prior to the scheduled start of the event and at the end of each event day. The Veterans Convention Centre will provide all necessary cleaning services.

Prior to the start of an exhibition/trade show any materials that are to be treated as refuse should be placed in plastic bags. All cardboard boxes to be removed from the show area shall be broken down and placed along the aisle in front of the booth; cardboard is a recyclable item. Please advise exhibitors to place their garbage cans or refuse along the aisle in front of their booth at the end of each show day for pick-up.

For Trade Shows, post show clean-up will be assessed following the move-out; extraordinary cleaning that is required and cost of removal and dumping will be billed directly to show manager. Contractors are encouraged to remove all recyclable materials.

CLIENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT

The Client Services Department represents the service delivery aspect of the Veterans Convention Centre. Client Services works in partnership with the Event Manager, the client and the service suppliers during an event. The Event Manager is responsible for coordinating and overseeing all aspects of the event to ensure its success.

COAT CHECK

The Veterans Convention Centre has a variety of spaces or rooms appropriate for a coat check facility. The Veterans Convention Centre is able to supply mobile coat rack units for any event at which a staffed coat check is required. Numbered tags are available for a nominal fee. The coat rack unit(s) are provided upon request free of charge; labour for the coat check staff is at the client's expense. The coat rack units are placed in convenient locations throughout the Veterans Convention Centre for delegates' coats, bags, etc. Delegates are responsible for items left at coat checks or on coat racks.

CONCESSIONS / CASH FOOD SALES

Concessions or cash food sales must be arranged with your Convention Services Manager and fiveelevenwest Hospitality Inc.

CONFETTI

The use of confetti is not permitted within the Convention Facilities.

CREDIT CARDS

The Veterans Convention Centre accepts VISA and Mastercard for payment of deposits and final invoices.

DAMAGE AND REPAIRS

Function area status with respect to fixtures and furnishings is formally documented on a daily basis to ensure that all function areas are clean and in good working order for our clients' use. The condition of your specific function areas are also noted prior to use so that damage caused by event related activities would be apparent. The client will be responsible for the cost of any repairs, replacements or extraordinary cleaning as a result of their use of the function areas in the Veterans Convention Centre. If you are aware of any damage, please inform the City before departing the Veterans Convention Centre.

DELIVERIES

The Veterans Convention Centre is unable to neither accept freight shipments on behalf of exhibitors nor permit exhibitors to deliver materials prior to scheduled move-in times. Exhibitors and/or Show/Event Management are responsible for the arrangements and related costs for off-site storage before, during, and after the rental period outlined in the License Agreement.

The Veterans Convention Centre will accept deliveries of conference-related materials and store them for the client provided the client has made previous arrangements with the City. Collect shipments will not be accepted.

ELECTRICAL

Standard electrical connectivity is available at the centre. For additional requirements these services may be arranged on an as needed basis.

ELEVATORS

Passenger elevators are located in the southwest corner of the lobby for access to the second floor meeting rooms. Passenger elevators are not to be used for transporting freight or equipment including easels, chairs, tables etc.

EVENT ACCOUNTING

The City of Summerside and fiveelevenwest Hospitality Inc. processes accounting for all events. The process for final billing is normally completed within ten working days after the completion of the event. City policy is the net balance is due thirty days after receipt of the final invoice.

FACILITIES FOR THE DISABLED

The Veterans Convention Centre is equipped with elevators, rest rooms and telephones which are designed to facilitate use by persons who are disabled. Wheelchair access to the Veterans Convention Centre is marked on the exterior of the building.

Services for delegates with hearing impairments is available through the Veterans Convention Centre audiovisual infrastructure.



FIRE AND SAFETY REGULATIONS

In the event that a portion of the exhibitor's back wall is a "fire exit door", the exhibitor must leave total access to it and may not drape it, cover it or obscure it in any way. Total access must be available from aisles to exits at all times and without obstruction of any kind.

The following materials shall be flameproof if used for display or decorative purposes: flowers, foliage paper, cardboard, or compressed paperboard less than 1/8 inch in thickness, plastic materials, split wood and bamboo fibres, Styrofoam and textiles.

To test materials, hold material to be tested in a vertical position, apply flame to the lower edge for a minimum of 12 seconds. To pass a test satisfactorily resistant to flame spread, a material should not continue to flame for more than two seconds after the test flame is removed.

It is not necessary to flameproof textiles, paper or other combustible merchandise on display for sale, but the quantity used shall be limited to the displaying of one salvageable length.

The use of an open flame is forbidden in the conference hall

Equipment must be set-up in such a manner to comply with approved safety standards and a suitable fire extinguisher shall be proved on recommendation of the inspector. If at any time the inspector deems such equipment to be operated in a manner dangerous to public safety, he or she shall cancel the privilege of the exhibitor concerned.

Flammable liquids or gases shall not be stored inside the building.

Displays must not encroach on exit doorways.

Boxes, crates and cartons from which merchandise has been removed, must be neatly piled in a storage area.



FOOD AND BEVERAGE SERVICES / CONCESSIONS

Provided exclusively by fiveelevenwest Hospitality Inc., Veterans Convention Centre has a full service kitchen on site offering a wide array of menu selections. fiveelevenwest Hospitality Inc. will work with you to ensure all needs for food and beverage requirements are met.

FURNISHINGS

Comfort and functionality is the standard at the Veterans Convention Centre. The Veterans Convention Centre is equipped with the finest in furnishings including comfort chairs, tables, podiums, stages and accessories and many other furnishings needed to execute your event. As well a commercial grade dishwasher is available for use within the centre along with many other features.

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

All services and products provided by the Veterans Convention Centre or its suppliers are subject to the Federal Goods and Services Tax (GST) of five per cent (5%). GST will be calculated and listed on the final invoice for all groups. PST and gratuities apply to all food and beverage items.

HELIUM BALLOONS

Helium balloons may not be distributed in the Veterans Convention Centre without written approval from the City.

INSURANCE AND INDEMNITY

Public Liability Insurance

The client will, at their expense, maintain public liability insurance that covers the client's use of the Veterans Convention Centre and has a limit for liability of not less than \$2 million each accident or occurrence. The coverage protects the client in the event a delegate, attendee, or another third party is injured in the course of their activities at the Veterans Convention Centre and subsequently chooses to take action against the conference organizer (client). The coverage includes property damage to the Veterans Convention Centre.

To cover any action(s) against the City of Summerside as a result of the above-mentioned injury/damage the City

of Summerside will be listed as an additional insured on the policy. The client will indemnify and save from responsibility the City and its officers, employees and agents for all claims, liabilities expenses and losses resulting from the client's use of the Veterans Convention Centre except those resulting from the sole negligence of a person for whom the City is legally responsible.

The client shall pay all costs and fees arising from the use of patented, trademarked, copyrighted or franchised materials, devices, processes, music, dramatic and other rights used in connection with the production of the event. The client shall indemnify all claims, damages, costs or expenses, including legal fees, suffered or incurred by the Veterans Convention Centre in connection with the event. The client will purchase host and liquor liability coverage for those events where liquor is served.

The client is required to give a copy of the valid insurance policy to the City prior to the use of the Veterans Convention Centre or their move-in date.

Personal Insurance

The client is responsible for obtaining personal insurance to cover damage or theft to personal property.

INTERNET CONNECTIVITY

Internet connectivity services are available in the Convention Centre.

LIQUOR LICENCE

The Veterans Convention Centre is focussed on responsible sale and service of alcohol. The Veterans Convention Centre's liquor licence extends to those events or activities that are held as part of or in conjunction with meetings, conferences, consumer shows and trade shows (non-liquor related).

No minors (under 19) are permitted in those areas where liquor is served other than in conjunction with a meal.

MEETING FURNISHINGS

The Veterans Convention Centre will provide the following complimentary items for your function room(s) upon request:

- Meeting chairs and/or tables set up in a pre-determined configuration
- Podium (stand-up) or lectern (tabletop)

- LCD Projector & Screen (one per convention room)
- Linens
- Wireless Internet
- Flags Bases, poles, Flags available upon request
- VIP service which includes pads, pencils and mints
- Parking Facilities

PARKING

Veterans Convention Centre has parking for over 790 cars/mini-vans, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Access to the Veterans Convention Centre is provided via the main entrance off Notre Dame Street on the east side of the building. Parking is free of charge to all events.

PHOTOGRAPHY

The City of Summerside retains its right to take photographs of any event for its own records and public promotional purposes.

RECYCLING

Summerside has a full recycling program for all forms of waste.

ROOM SET-UP FEES

The Veterans Convention Centre provides tables and chairs in pre-determined configurations. The standard room set-up is as a minimum, one hour prior to the meeting. In order that the Veterans Convention Centre provides the best in level of service, we would request your full event information including desired set-up at least 14 days prior to the event. Extensive room set-up changes will incur additional costs.



SOCAN

The Society of Composers, Authors and Music Publishers of Canada has a license fee for each event where music is played, live or recorded. Please see appendix for rates.

SECURITY

Any after hours event or event requiring alcoholic beverage requires a security guard on site. All security is provided via contract with facility and a minimal charge of \$15/guard per hour plus GST is applicable.

SET UP AND TEAR DOWNS

All clients and exhibitors are to unload their vehicles through the north end of the facility and not through the front doors of the Veterans Convention Centre. Any damage to the building as a result of moving materials in through the front doors is the responsibility of the client and/or exhibitor.

SMOKING

The Credit Union Place and Veterans Convention Centre is a smoke free facility.

TABLES / TABLE LINENS

All Veterans Convention Centre tables have finished table surfaces and edges that provide a smooth and clean writing surface. All tables used for food and beverage services, boardroom meetings, classroom, hollow square and U-shape configurations come with tablecloths and/or skirting. Clients or suppliers are not permitted to staple or otherwise affix nails or screws into tables (extra costs may apply).

TAXES

There are two "consumer" taxes which apply to the sale or rental of products and services supplied through the Veterans Convention Centre: a Federal Goods and

Services Tax (GST) and a Provincial Sales Tax (PST).

Clients will be informed as to the appropriate taxes for the various levels of services or products.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS

Telephones, telephone lines, fax lines, modem lines or special service lines can be installed to any function area within the Convention space

The Veterans Convention Centre is networked with high-speed video and data capabilities.

The Veterans Convention Centre has the capacity to offer the latest in videoconferencing services.

WASHROOMS

Washroom facilities for the convention space are located off the main conference space at the north end of the building.

WHEELCHAIR ACCESS

Access to the Veterans Convention Centre and its function areas are designed to accommodate those persons dependent upon wheelchairs or motorized carts for personal mobility. Please inform staff of any guests, delegates or presenters that will attend your events in wheelchairs so that the Veterans Convention Centre can ensure the needs are best looked after for your event.

WASTE REMOVAL

To ensure the smooth transition from event to event the Veterans Convention Centre asks the client for assistance in identifying events which are likely to produce more than normal cleaning requirements, exhibitions involving food and beverage samples or theme events likely to produce extraordinary clean-up requirements.

Excessive waste removal may result in additional charges to the client for removal.

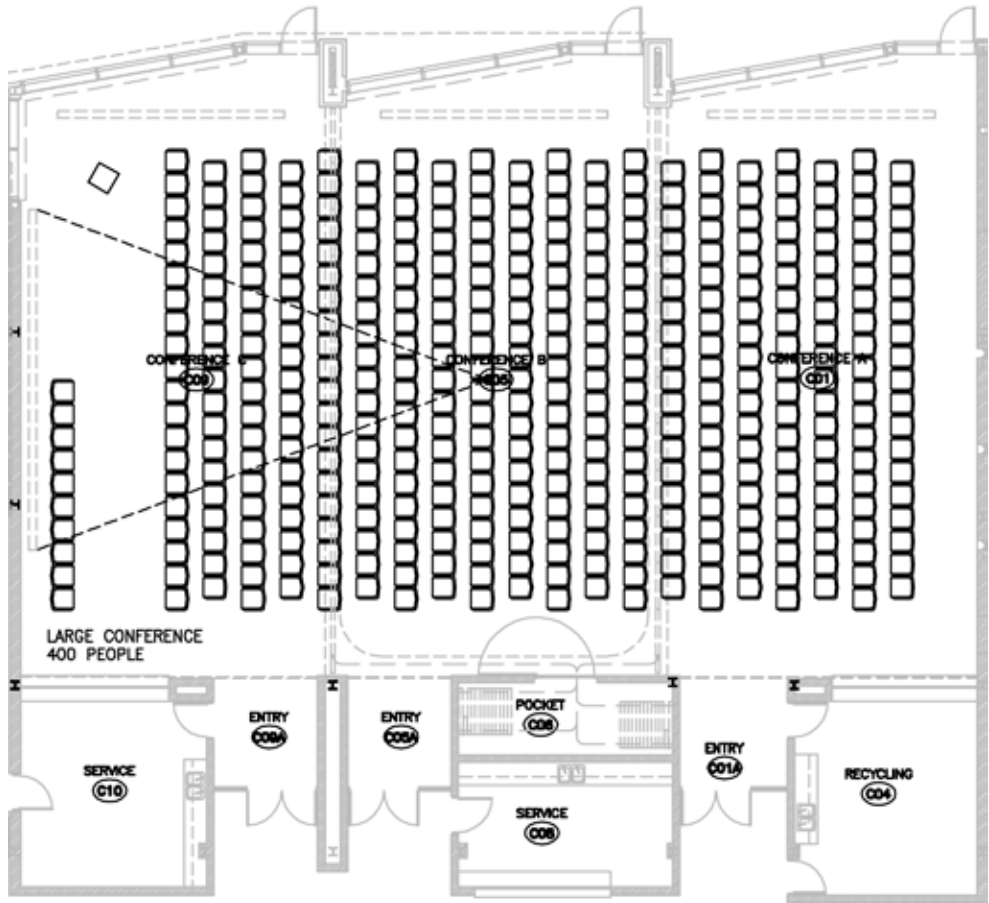

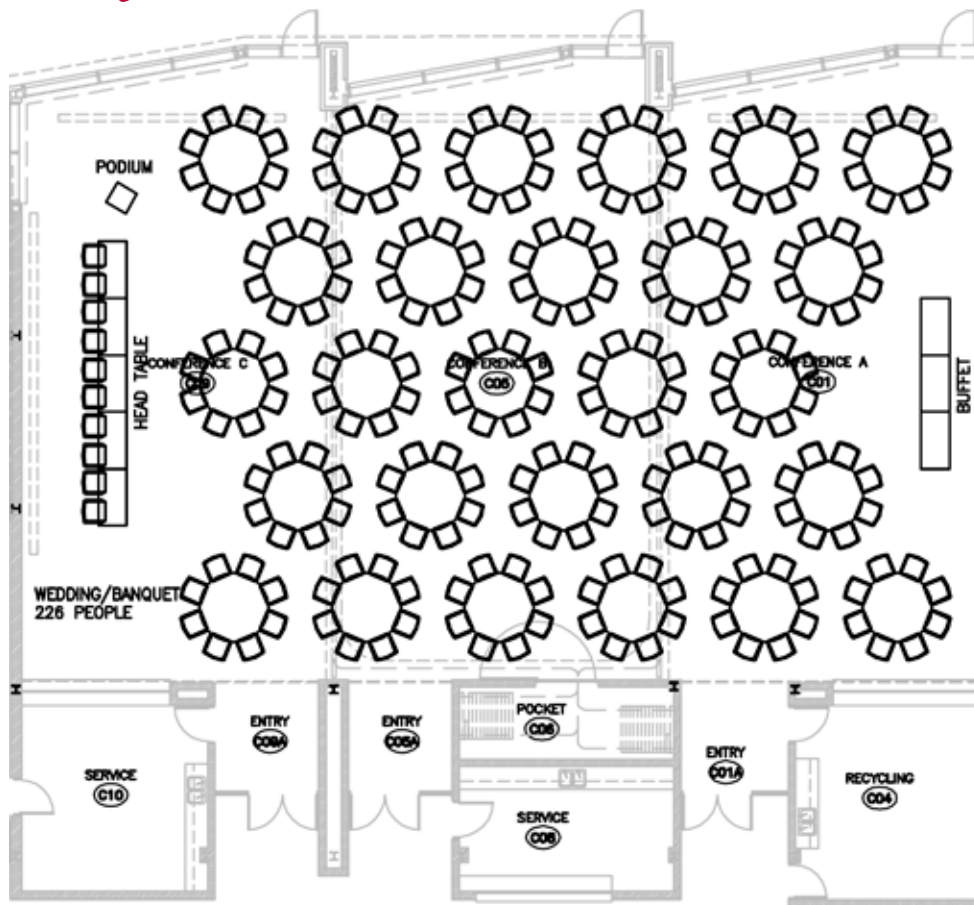

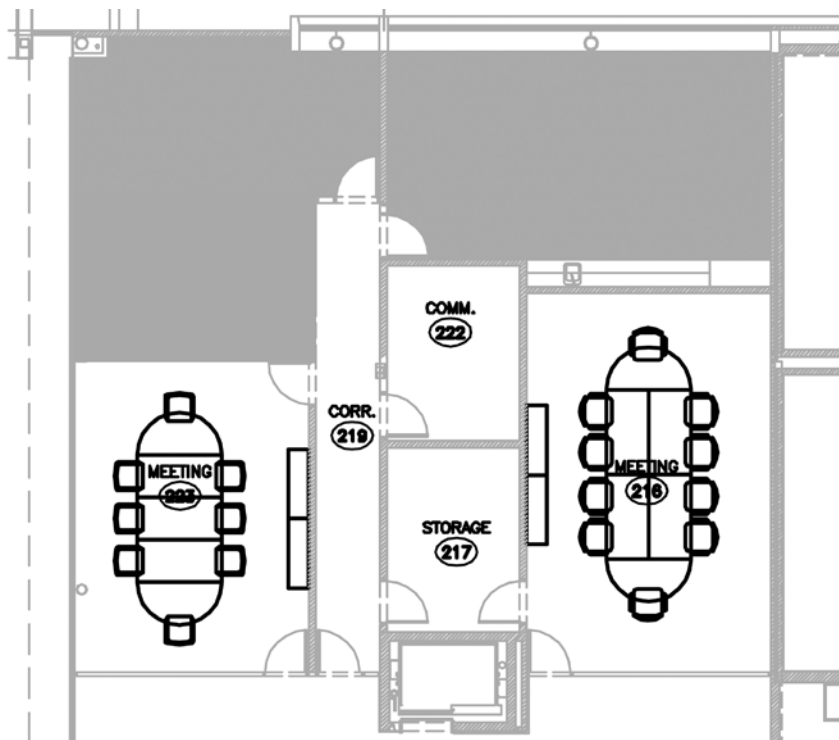
LARGE CONFERENCE SEATING ARRANGEMENT – 400 PEOPLE



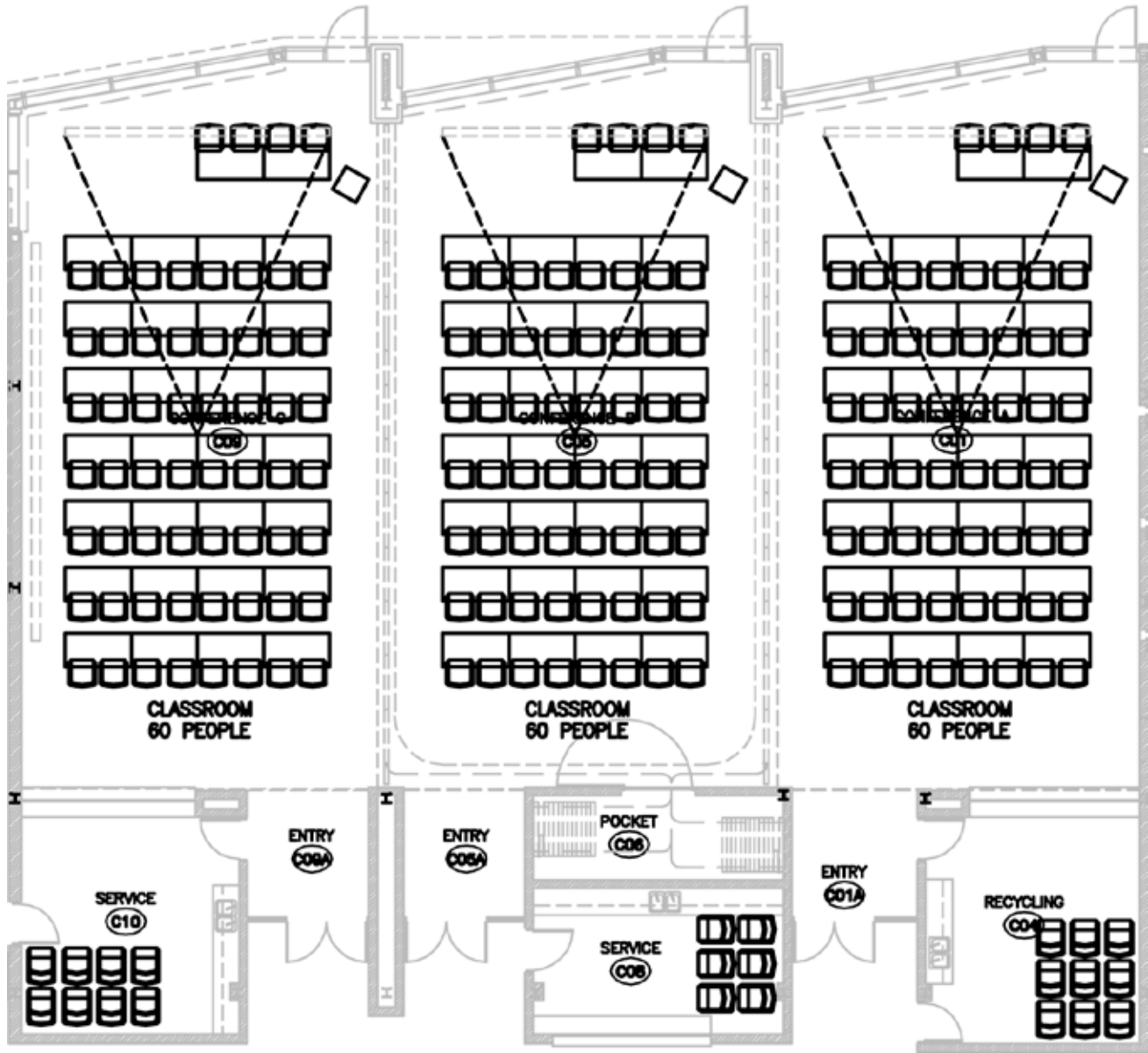
WEDDING / BANQUET SEATING ARRANGEMENT – 225 PEOPLE



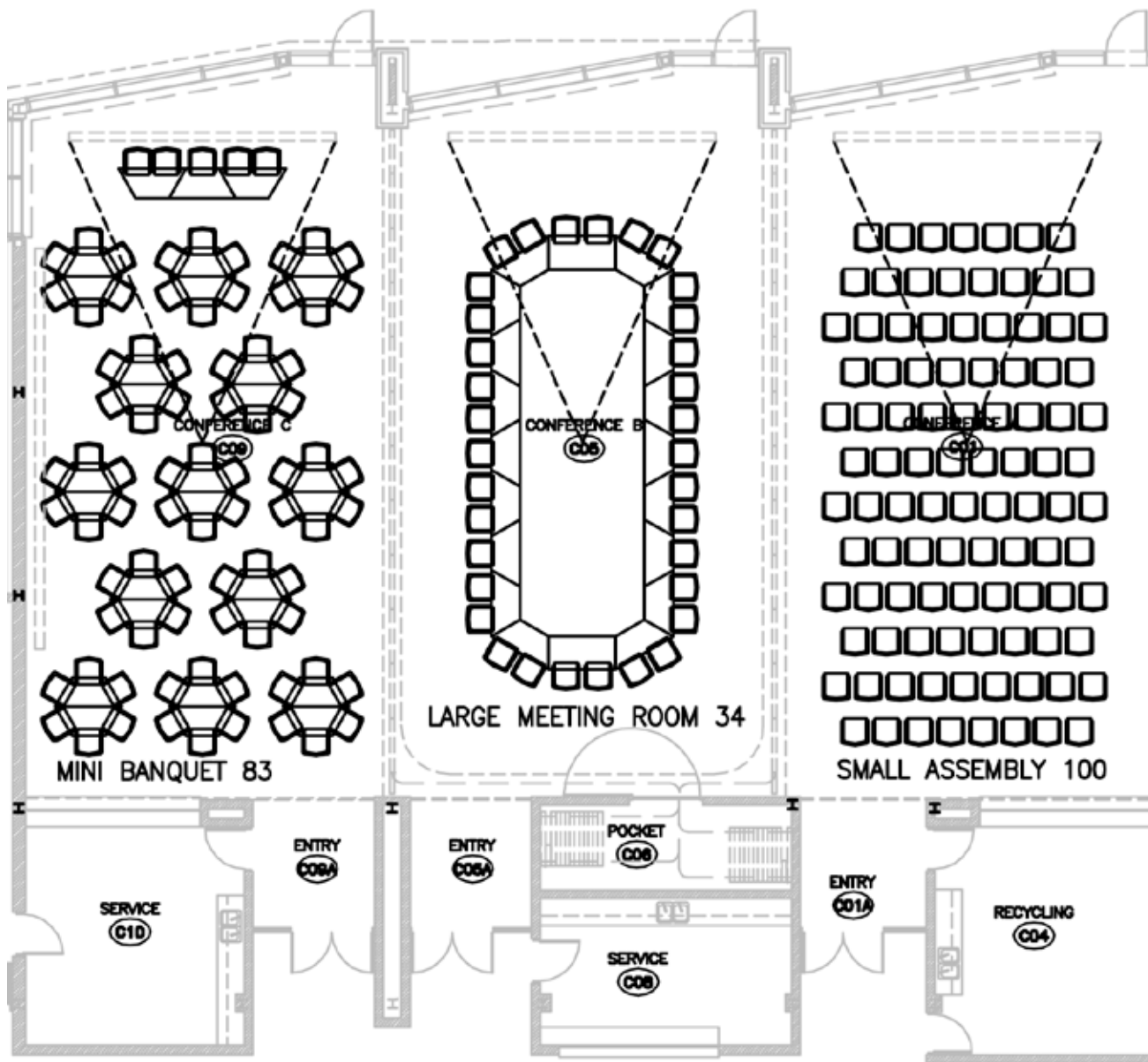

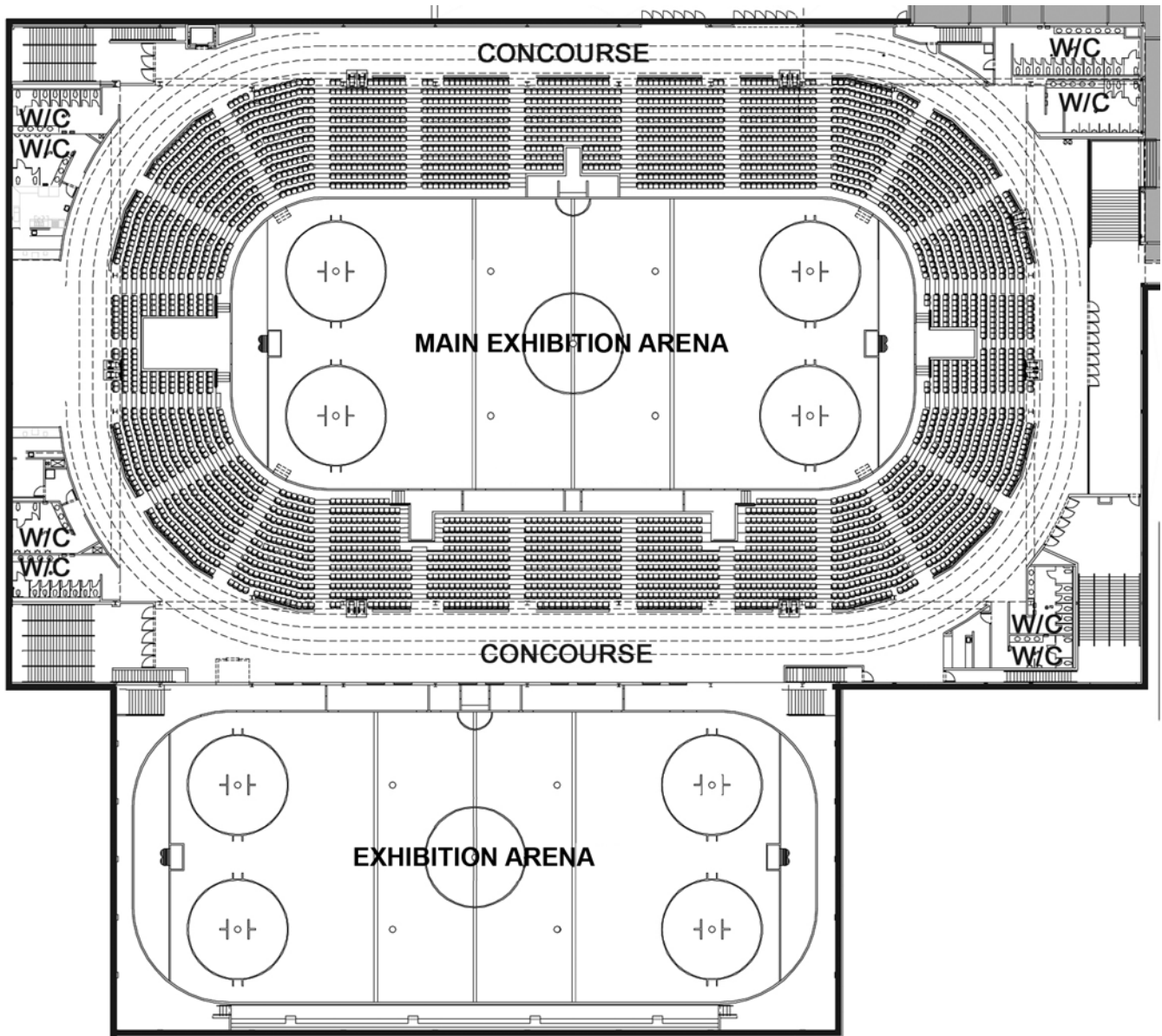
